Учебное пособие по английскому языку предназначено для студентов 2-3 курсов специальностей 24.02.01 «Производство летательных аппаратов» и 25.02.06 «Производство и обслуживание авиационной техники». There are five main parts of the aircraft: the power plant, the fuselage, the wings, the tail unit (empennage) and the landing gear (undercarriage).

The fuselage is the central body of the plane. The power plant provides power for flight. The wings support the plane in the air. The tail unit provides stability. The landing gear supports the plane on the ground.

The main parts of the fuselage are the nose, the cockpit, the cabin, the cargo compartments and the tail.

The main parts of the empennage are the fin, the stabilizer or tail plane, the rudder and the elevator.

The main parts of the wing are the centre wing, the outer wing, the wing tips, the wing flaps and the ailerons.

The main parts of the landing gear are the main gear, the wheels, the shock absorber or strut and the retracting mechanism, the nose gear.

The main parts of the power plant are the nacelle, the engine mount, the engine, the oil cooler and the propeller.

I'm a flight engineer. I fly on TU-154, I do much work on the ground and in the air. Before the flight I walk around the aircraft and make an inspection I inspect the nose wheel, I check the ground locks, inspect the main gear, nacelle No One and Two. Then I walk under the fuselage to the tail and inspect the rudder and elevators. I check all equipment on boar. I check it according to the special list for the flight. I start up and run up the engines and check the fuel pressure.

During the flight I sit between the captain and the co-pilot (behind the navigator) and look at the engine instruments. I handle the controls for the landing gear and the wing flags at takeoff and landing. I retract and lower the landing gear.

After landing I write my technical repot and brief the station engineer about the problems (snags) on the aircraft in flight.

MAIN PARTS OF THE HELICOPTER

There are 5 main parts of the helicopter: the power plant, the fuselage, the landing gear, the main rotor (the lifting rotor) and the rear rotor (antitorque).

The fuselage is the central body of the helicopter. The power plant provides power for the flight.

The lifting or main rotor supports the helicopter in the air and provides fore-aft control, lateral control and main rotor collective pitch control. The lifting rotor creates lift.

The antitorque provides directional stability and directional control. The main parts of the antitorque are three blades, the airscrew boss, the gear box, the actuator and control linkage.

The main parts of the fuselage are the cockpit, the cabin, two engine boxes, the main gear box, and the external fuel tanks.

The main parts of the power plant are two turboprop engines, the main gear box, the fuel system, the oil system, 2 oil coolers, the main gear box fan or cooling fan and control linkage, the engine mount, the hydraulic system.

The main parts of the main rotor are five blades, the airscrew boss, the swash plate and 3 actuators.

The main parts of the landing gear are two main gears, the nose gear, the wheels and the shock absorbers. The landing gear supports the helicopter in the ground.

DUTIES OF A FLIGHT MECHANIC

I'm a flight mechanic, I fly on a helicopter. Before the flight I make preflight checks.] check records in the logbook, I make an inspection of the main parts of the helicopter: the cockpit, the fuselage, external fuel tanks, absorbers and wheels, and blades.

I inspect the engines, main gear box, swash plate, see-saw, hydraulic system and the controls. I check all instruments and devices in the cockpit. I check if there is enough fuel for flight. I refuel the tanks. I check oil pressure in the engines and in the gear box after I start up and run up the engines. During flight I sit between the captain and the co-pilot. I regulate the oil and fuel pressure. I report the captain about any problems in flight. I make minor repairs in flight.

After landing I inspect the helicopter and make records in the log book.

MAINTENANCE TECHNICAN

The flight engineers (aircraft maintenance mechanics) are members of flight crew. All mechanical and electrical devices aboard planes must work properly.

Their duties are: routine servicing, maintenance of aircraft (helicopter), determination and repair of faults, maintaining or overhauling aircraft and components.

They must inspect, repair and service airframe, engines, equipment, instruments and radio. Before the flight the flight engineer makes pre-flight inspection on apron. He must check maintenance records. He has to check the outside parts of the plane.

He may locate any faulty equipment. He must call a mechanic who has to make repairs. He inflates tires, fills fuel tanks and oil reservoirs, lubricates fittings, corrects fluid level in shock strut of landing gear, checks tension of controls, and cleans mechanical parts with compressed air and cleaning fluid. He may replace lights and faulty wiring; he may clean off engines. He checks main parts that affect the operation of the aircraft using many tools, ladders or platforms.

He must start up and run up the engines. In flight he is to assist the captain. He must watch (observe) instrument readings, he must check functioning of electrical systems. He is to adjust the electrical power. He is to watch engine instruments and regulate the performance of the engines, air conditioning and other equipment. He has to keep records of engine performance and fuel consumption. He is to lower and retract the landing gear. He must stop the engines.

He is to report any mechanical problems to the captain; he may have to make some emergency repairs in flight or some minor repairs on the ground.
